Wednesday Harp Circle at Fair Haven


Welcome to Harp Circle.




I came to Fair Haven to visit my mother, Mildred, as I do on Wednesdays, I won't go into detail about how I always go home depressed over Mom's condition.




I came into the building, and there they were. People with HARPS!

One day, recently, Mom was having a bad day. I set my harp aside and sat with her. Suddenly she said, "I want a diamond"




I played along. "Ok, Mom, we'll get you one. Do you need one? Are you hurting somewhere?"



Ruth and Naomi Senior Outreach (RNSO) has been honored to foster three harp circles in Birmingham, Alabama - at the First Light Center for Homeless Women and Children, South Highland Presbyterian Church and Fair Haven Retirement Center - all for the purpose of sharing the art of playing the Celtic harp and spreading the mission of RNSO: to bring joy to older adults living in isolation through companionship, unconditional acceptance and the beauty of music. Harp Circles essentially model musical companioning. As Ruth is to Naomi and as David is to Saul in the Hebrew Scriptures, our harpers are companions to those we meet along the way, specifically our friends in the nursing homes. The Harp Circle harpers join the ranks of the pioneers of culture change in long term care, discovering new ways of honoring the old old and providing healing care through a loving presence.
